About the Village: Borimalpada is situated around 68km from Kharghar. The nearest railway station to reach Borimal village is Khopoli. It is around 20 Kms from Khopoli station which takes around 45 mins to travel to reach the exact location. The village constitutes around 40 houses with a population of 250 approximately staying there. Most of villagers are engaged in agriculture and agriculture related work or employed nearby small scale industries. The land of this region is fertile. Multi-cropping is practiced where ample amounts of water is available or else single season cropping is carried out. The village has one Zilla Parishad school upto 4th Standard.

How to reach: Nearest railway station is Khopoli. It took almost 45min to reach exact location

Identified Areas of Improvement at the Adopted Village

1. **Lack of availability of water:** The primary problem residents of Borimal Pada is face availability of water for drinking and domestic purpose. During month of February and onwards till June the all available water resources dries up and residents of Borimal pada has to travel around 2-3 km for water resources on daily basis.
2. **Water tank maintenance:** The water which was build by NSS unit of Saraswati College of Engineering needs to maintenance.
3. **Low Attendance in ZP Schools and lack of interest in education :** As Agriculture is the main occupation, children in their tender age are forced to help parents at farms instead of attending school which further widens the lack of awareness about education, its need and importance. Needs improvement in order to have atmosphere which brings positive energy in the students.
4. **Lack of Awareness about health, hygiene and General Cleanliness:** The villagers lack general health awareness due to limited livelihood resources, lack of general awareness, minimal education and customs. The area receives spiritual tourists and littering results in lack of General Cleanliness.

Contribution towards Improvement of Adopted Village

1. Aesthetic and Improved changes in School building by:
 - a. Building compound/wall around school periphery
 - b. Colouring and repairing the broken walls of school premises.
 - c. Providing continues supply of energy using 2 Solar panel in school.
2. Water conservation
 - a. Continuous Contour Trenches (CCT) increase the water level therefore villagers can use water in well throughout the year.
 - b. Need to use soil excavated to build bunds or ridges on the lower side of the trenches which further enhance water retention.
3. Vocational Training and Seminar for villagers
 - a. To construct small workshops for the childrens and adultson topics like health and hygiene, vocational training in painting, dancing, etc.,
4. Educational Awareness Campaigns through street plays, individual counselling, training in digital skills to School children to enhance their interest in practical learning.
5. Regular *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan* to inculcate habits of personal hygiene and Awareness Campaigns through Street Play, Posters etc

7.1 WATER CONSERVATION

8.4 Other Health Activity



8.5 Awareness programs / Rallies / Campaigns organized

a) Aids Awareness:

AIDS awareness plays a crucial role in preventing the transmission of HIV, the virus that causes AIDS. Knowledge about how the virus is transmitted, such as through unprotected sexual intercourse, sharing needles, or from mother to child during childbirth or breastfeeding, helps individuals make informed decisions and adopt preventive measures.

Timely awareness about AIDS can encourage individuals to get tested for HIV. Early diagnosis allows for early initiation of antiretroviral therapy (ART), which can effectively control the virus and improve the quality and length of life for people living with HIV/AIDS. Awareness about the importance of regular testing and accessing healthcare services can lead to early detection and better management of the disease.

The NSS volunteers, along with expert speakers and healthcare professionals, collaborated to design an informative and engaging webinar. Prior to the event, the NSS unit promoted the webinar through various channels, inviting students, faculty, and community members to participate.

The AIDS logo demonstrates:

- **care and concern** about HIV and AIDS for those who are living with HIV, those who are ill, for those who have died and for those who care for and support those directly affected.
- **hope** that the search for a vaccine and cure to halt the suffering is successful.
- **Support** for those living with HIV, for the continuing education of the infected, for maximum efforts to find effective treatments, cures or vaccines and for those who have lost friends, family members or loved ones.

Progression from HIV infection to stages of AIDS

Normal healthy individual

Starts infected with HIV

WINDY PERIOD (3-12 weeks or even 6 months)
(Antibodies to virus are not developed, the virus is not replicating but still present in the blood)

HIV Positive
(The amount of antibodies can be detected in the blood)
The immune system is still working on the infection but is weakened

May take up to 10 to 12 years to reach the stage of AIDS, the period can be prolonged through available treatment

How HIV does not spread?

- HIV does not spread by normal social contact:
 - Working hand
 - Using together in the same house / hotel
 - Sharing clothes/towels
 - Sharing toilets
 - Being together
 - Through mosquitoes bite
- **Sharing equipment** (television, computers, medicines etc.)
- **Kissing**
 - Does not spread by social kissing as viral load in saliva is low
 - In the presence of ulcers in the mouth or bleeding gums - deep kiss french kissing may be risky

g) Contribution to PM Yojana's

The Government of India, through various schemes, is committed to improving the life of the general public.

Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana was launched by the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas for providing LPG cylinders at a concessional rate to women below poverty line. These women are generally dependent on wood for cooking.

A major portion of the society was left out of financial inclusion thereby widening the gap between rich and poor. A basic absence of a bank account was an impediment in receiving Government benefits. Pradhan Mantri Jandhan Yojana was launched as a National Mission for financial inclusion so that the beneficiaries can have a basic bank account, earn interest, avail overdraft facility and be eligible for Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT). Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY), Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), Atal Pension Yojana (APY), Micro Units Development & Refinance Agency Bank (MUDRA) scheme. Our Volunteers created awareness of this scheme through posters, street plays and by conducting a drive to help people enrol for Jandhan Yojana.

A very large section of people in India are not covered under Insurance. When a bread earner of a family member passes away the family suffers a lot as there is no financial support to carry on with the life. This results in children dropping out of school leading to poor literacy, increase in crime etc. Government too has to spend a considerable amount under Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Anudan Yojana. To address these issues, the Government of India launched Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Bima Yojana to provide insurance cover for the people. Our Volunteers created awareness of this scheme through posters, street plays and by conducting drives to help people enrol for Jeevan Bima Yojana.

So our NSS unit set up a library in the adopted village and installed books for children so that they learn the importance of Education and how it can build them a career. Our volunteers even encouraged the children to go school by painting the school walls.

In this fast moving world, technology plays a important role in everyone's life. The world is becoming cashless but still there are many areas where technology haven't even reached. So our volunteers introduced the villagers to use modern bill paying techniques and even educated them and spread awareness about the various government schemes that they must avail and also about health and hygiene and encouraging women to know their rights.

Though we all conducted Tree Plantation but what about providing them with constant nutrition. They also require care for that they require manure and compost, so the NSS unit Of SCOE built a Compost Pit.

8.12 Other Outstanding Achievements

1. Contribution to Flood Relief Drive at Kolhapur.

Satara, Sangli, Kolhapur have many small villages on the banks of Panchaganga, Bhogavati, Koyna, Warna which are tributaries of Krishna river, the largest in Maharashtra. Agriculture, the main source of livelihood of the people, is dependent on Krishna river and its tributaries. The incessant rains between 5th to 8th August 2019, totalling around 900 mm of rain, which was over 400 percent above normal, broke the banks of Krishna and all its tributaries. The flash floods inundated almost every village that was settled on its banks. People did not even get time to untie the cattle for them to find a safe place and many lost their lives. Those who survived lost crops, cattle and households. Many houses collapsed and there was utter chaos.

In response to the call from Vice Chancellor Prof. Suhas Pednekar, the NSS cell of the University of Mumbai took the initiative to assist flood-affected victims in Satara, Sangli, and Kolhapur. The NSS unit promptly sprang into action and appealed for contributions of daily essentials necessary for survival. The drive received overwhelming support from all 18 educational institutions of Mumbai Pradesh Aarya Vidya Sabha, with contributions coming from management, trustees, secretaries, principals, staff, and students.

The NSS volunteers collected the following items for distribution: 804 liters of water bottles, 7 liters of oil pouches, 264 kilograms of rice, 47 kilograms of wheat, 17.5 kilograms of dal, 18 kilograms of sugar, 13 kilograms of salt, 10 kilograms of sprouts, 2.1 kilograms of tea powder, 408 pieces of clothing, medicines, 3 sets of sanitizers, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soaps, undergarments, more than 200 bags of rice, biscuits, clothes, and other essentials.

On 17th August 2019, the entire truckload of relief material was dispatched with two staff members from Saraswati College of Engineering accompanying the shipment. On 18th August 2019, the relief material was personally distributed by staff members in coordination with Karmaveer Bhaurao Pail College, Vashi.






